Highlights from the Sydney Meeting Face-to-Face Meeting

From August 23-25 2025, the Global Forum on Maintenance and Asset Management (GFMAM) convened in Sydney, Australia, for a second face-to-face meeting of the year hosted by the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA). This meeting brought together representatives from member organizations from around the world to collaborate on advancing key global initiatives in maintenance and asset management.

The meeting featured in-depth discussions reviewing the success of Global Maintenance Day 2025, including learnings to take into 2026, and progress on current GFMAM projects focused on reliability and the mapping of qualifications, accreditations and membership grades. New GFMAM project opportunities were also discussed and approved.



Some representatives from GFMAM were also honoured to attend a reception at Government House, Sydney, at the invitation of Her Excellency the Honourable Margaret Beazley AC KC, Governor of New South Wales.



GFMAM representatives also enjoyed some social gatherings against a backdrop of the iconic Sydney landmarks, fostering camaraderie and cultural exchange among the international delegates.



Following the meeting, the GFMAM representatives took part in our hosts' Institute of Public Works Conference, IPWC25.



Projects Update

GFMAM continues its work to collaborate on knowledge, standards and practices, publishing resources that support global maintenance and asset management practices.

Completed Projects

Over the past six months, we have:

- Celebrated Global Maintenance Day on 9 June

- Published the revised GFMAM Competency Specification for an ISO 55001 Asset Management System Assessor to align with ISO55001:2024

Project 34 to further develop work on asset management indicators and their implementation.

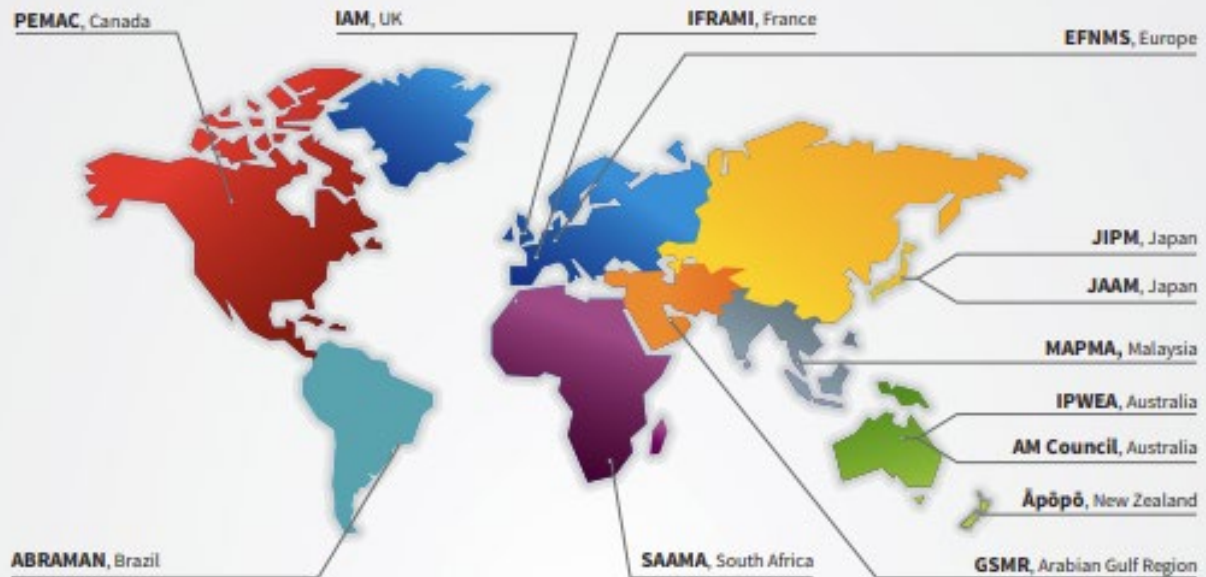

To bring together, promote and strengthen the Maintenance and Asset Management community worldwide.

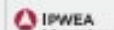
To support the establishment and development of associations or institutions whose aims are maintenance and/or asset management focused.
